SCHOOL UNIFORM

All children at Gainsborough are expected to wear our school uniform; it supports our sense of belonging and family. **Please label your child's clothes with their name.** Our school colours are **navy and white**. Jewellery is not generally allowed in school, but small stud ear-rings and a watch may be worn. These **MUST** be removed for all PE lessons, children should be able to do this themselves or not wear them to school.

SCHOOL TIMES

The school gates open at **8.40am**. Please make sure that all children are in school by **8.50am** at the latest. School finishes at **3.15pm**. Parents should make sure that their children are collected on time. If there are any changes to your usual collection arrangements please phone the school to let us know.

Attendance and Punctuality

We will start using the newsletter to inform you of attendance and punctuality figures for all classes. We were disappointed that due to dropping attendance figures in the last two weeks of the summer term our overall attendance reduced and we slipped below our 96% target despite good attendance figures in other parts of the year. We were able to celebrate with a party for the best Class attendance for the year (Miss Liu's class) and wristbands for 100% attendance. Let's keep working on this.

We have an obligation to follow up absences of all children when they fall below 95% and a legal duty to put actions in place to ensure attendance improves. Please work with us on this.

It is our policy that term-time holiday is unauthorised but in extremely exceptional circumstances, where evidence is provided, a limited amount of time may be authorised. Term-time holiday may be subject to a penalty fine and referrals made to the Educational Attendance Officer. We would like to thank all those parents/carers who have supported the school in this decision. We appreciate how expensive it is to take a vacation during school holidays. **There have been families who have been fined for taking children out during school time – this is a fine for each parent for each child.** This is common Newham policy.

The figure for 'Persistent Absenteeism' is now attendance below 90% and any pupil who has a figure below this figure, or poor punctuality, throughout the year will be discussed with our Attendance Officer. Punctuality is vital to a good start to the school day for pupils and we thank all our families who ensure that children arrive ready to start learning at 8.50am. The gate opens at 8.40am.

Nut-free and Healthy Eating School

We are a nut-free school – with many children with life threatening nut allergies. As nut allergies can include seeds (including sesame seed) and nut-oils, we ask that packed lunches and snacks are free from these products, including seeded bread and chocolate spreads, which contain nuts.

It is school policy that we encourage healthy lunches and snacks. If we have concerns about the content of your child's packed lunch or the amount they eat, we will contact parents/carers. Crisps and chocolate bars are not allowed as a break-time snack (nor fizzy drinks).

Breakfast Club and Monday to Friday Club

Both these clubs now have more children than spaces. We are unable to take children who have not booked and paid for a space in either club. We will be sending out further information in September. Please see the school office for further details and to confirm your child's place for September. Both clubs will start (for those booked) on Monday 5th September.

Other after school clubs

We are continuing with clubs this year. A letter will be sent out next week detailing the clubs available. Please return the slip as soon as possible. Clubs will start the week commencing Monday 19th September.
